Captain Skuby is currently the Chief of Staff for the First Coast Guard District assuming that position on 4 June 2007.

Captain Skuby graduated from the Coast Guard Academy in 1979 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Government. His first assignment was as a deck watch officer on the USCGC HAMILTON, home-ported in Boston, Massachusetts. After 2+ years as the ship's Navigator and Communications Officer, he commenced his marine safety career. Assignments included tours at the Merchant Marine Technical Office in New Orleans, Louisiana; Marine Safety Office San Francisco; Marine Safety Detachment Concord, California; Coast Guard Headquarters in the offices of Hazardous Materials (G-MTH) and Vessel Inspections (G-MVI); Group/Captain of the Port Long Island Sound, located in New Haven, Connecticut; Marine Safety Office Hampton Roads, located in Norfolk, Virginia; Group/Marine Safety Office Long Island Sound; Coast Guard Headquarters, serving as the Chief, Budget and Resource Division for the Marine Safety Program; Marine Safety Office Honolulu, Commanding Officer; Sector Honolulu, where he led the transition/merger of the Marine Safety Office and Group Honolulu and was the initial Sector Commander; and Executive Assistant to the Assistant Commandant for Prevention – CG-3P (formerly the Assistant Commandant for Marine Safety, Security and Environmental Protection).



Captain Skuby has a Masters in Business Administration, earned in 1989 from the University of Phoenix. His personal awards include four Meritorious Service Medals, three Coast Guard Commendation Medals, two Coast Guard Achievement Medals, two Commandant's Letters of Commendation, six Coast Guard Meritorious Team Awards, the National Defense Medal with two bronze stars, and the Humanitarian Service Medal. He also has earned and wears the Marine Safety and Environmental Protection Professional Pin.
